PLACES TO SEE



- 1 BUFFALO AKG ART MUSEUM**
1285 Elmwood Avenue
Known for one of the world's most significant collections of modern and contemporary art, Buffalo AKG Art Museum sits at the heart of a remarkable neighborhood where art and everyday life are beautifully intertwined.
- 2 BUFFALO ARTS STUDIO**
2495 Main Street
Since 1991, Buffalo Arts Studio has provided affordable studio space for visual artists and remarkable exhibitions for the community.
- 3 THE BUFFALO HISTORY MUSEUM**
1 Museum Court
The memories of a city live on in a beautiful neoclassical building — the only remaining structure from the 1901 Pan-American Exposition.
- 4 THE BUFFALO ZOO**
300 Parkside Avenue
The nation's third zoo is home to over a thousand exotic animals and plays an essential role in a variety of local, and global conservation efforts.
- 5 BURCHFIELD PENNEY ART CENTER**
1300 Elmwood Avenue
Dedicated to the art and vision of Charles E. Burchfield and other regional artists whose work celebrates Buffalo's diverse creative community.
- 6 DELAWARE PARK**
84 Parkside Avenue
The largest of the parks in the revolutionary park and parkway system designed by legendary landscape architect Frederick Law Olmsted, who considered Buffalo "the best planned city... in the United States, if not the world."
- 7 DELAWARE PARK ROSE GARDEN**
199 Lincoln Parkway
The Rose Garden and its pergola, built in 1917, remain a focal point of Delaware Park and feature 33 beds of All-America Rose Selections.
- 8 FOREST LAWN CEMETERY**
1990 Main Street
One of the first professionally designed and landscaped cemeteries in the United States, Forest Lawn's 269 acres feature unmatched natural beauty, sculptural masterpieces (including the Frank Lloyd Wright-designed Blue Sky Mausoleum), and expansive archives and genealogical resources.
- 9 FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT'S MARTIN HOUSE**
125 Jewett Parkway
Described by Wright as his "domestic symphony," The Darwin D. Martin House Estate is considered to be one of the most important projects from the architect's Prairie School era.
- 10 THE JAPANESE GARDEN**
1 Museum Court
The Japanese Garden in Delaware Park was established through a special sister-city initiative between Kanazawa, Japan and Buffalo, and its beauty makes it a perfect spot for quiet reflection.
- 11 THE LIPSEY ARCHITECTURE CENTER BUFFALO**
444 Forest Avenue
Located in the Richardson Olmsted Campus, the LACB is intended to serve as a gathering place to explore architecture and city planning as inspired by Buffalo's outstanding architectural heritage.

PLACES TO EAT AND DRINK

- 12 BAR VAUX**
444 Forest Avenue (on the Richardson Olmsted Campus)
Creative and classic cocktails are served alongside small plates and other creations — all on tables made of reclaimed and repurposed materials from the Richardson Olmsted Campus.
- 13 CAFÉ BAR MORIARTY**
1650 Elmwood Avenue
Part of Moriarty Meats (a French-style whole animal butchery), this smart café features light fare, coffee, beer, and wine — and a wonderful selection of Spanish tinned fish.
- 14 CAFÉ CALVERT** (on the Richardson Olmsted Campus)
444 Forest Avenue
Featuring the best local coffees and pastries, Café Calvert is a great place to take a break and enjoy the remarkable architecture of Henry Hobson Richardson.
- 15 CAFFE AROMA**
957 Elmwood Avenue
Buffalo's longest-running locally owned coffee shop serves great coffee and espresso, as well as a full bar and light dining. Its location at the corner of Elmwood Ave and Bidwell Parkway means it's one of those places where everyone ends up.
- 16 COLE'S**
1104 Elmwood Avenue
A timeless local institution, Cole's serves an astonishing variety of beer and some of the best Buffalo food in town — including a combo that lets you sample both Beef on Weck and wings.
- 17 CORNELIA**
1285 Elmwood Avenue (at the AKG)
Sun-soaked and full of art, Cornelia is one of Buffalo's most photogenic dining spots. A range of inventive dishes featuring local ingredients are served, along with stylishly packed alfresco dinners for patrons of Shakespeare in the Park.
- 18 CUCINA**
444 Forest Avenue (on the Richardson Olmsted Campus)
Cucina ("Kitchen" in Italian) serves a sophisticated blend of traditional and contemporary dishes inspired by the rich culinary heritage of Northern Italy.
- 19 DANIELA**
387 Forest Avenue
A broad and inventive menu offers contemporary takes on classics, with a focus on Italian food. Try the Pinsa — a traditional form of hand-pressed pizza prepared in a pan.
- 20 THE DAPPER GOOSE**
491 Amherst Street
A popular local spot that features New American cuisine, unforgettable cocktails, and a beautiful urban patio. Their ever-changing collection of delicious small plates highlight local produce and ingredients.
- 21 FORTY THIEVES KITCHEN AND BAR**
727 Elmwood Avenue
An elegant pub featuring craft beers, a wide variety of whiskey (and whisky), and elevated pub fare.
- 22 THE GLOBE MARKET**
762 Elmwood Avenue
Fresh food, friendly people, and some of the most beloved sandwiches in a city that really loves sandwiches make Globe Market a perennial favorite on the Elmwood Strip.
- 23 HUTCH'S**
1375 Delaware Avenue
One of Buffalo's favorite fine-dining mainstays, Hutch's has been redefining city dining for over a quarter century. An American take on the traditional French Bistro, Hutch's is both lively and intimate.
- 24 INDIA GATE**
1116 Elmwood Avenue
A long-time Buffalo favorite, India Gate serves authentic Northern Indian cuisine a short walk from the AKG.
- 25 JACK RABBIT**
1010 Elmwood Avenue
A full-service restaurant and music venue with a scratch kitchen and full bar, Jack Rabbit is a relative newcomer to the neighborhood, but has already developed a devoted following.
- 26 LLOYAL'S FAMOUS LASAGNA WITH A TOUCH OF SOUL**
1122 Elmwood Avenue
For years, Shawntorian Travis' friends and family would taste his lasagna and tell him he should open a restaurant. So he did, further bolstering Buffalo's status as the Comfort Food Capital of North America.
- 27 NICK'S PLACE**
504 Amherst Street
This iconic Buffalo diner features Greek specialties and is a go-to breakfast spot for those in the know.

PLACES TO STAY

- 28 OLIVER'S**
2095 Delaware Avenue
For almost 90 years, Oliver's has been synonymous with fine dining in Buffalo. Modern American fare and a vast wine list are served impeccably in a sophisticated, comfortable environment.
- 29 THE SCULPTURE BAR**
1285 Elmwood Avenue (at the AKG)
Located in the new Gundlach Building at the Buffalo AKG Art Museum, The Sculpture Bar features grab-and-go sandwiches, salads, and drinks to patrons of the museum's ticketed area.
- 30 THE TERRACE AT DELAWARE PARK**
199 Lincoln Parkway
Featuring contemporary global cuisine with an emphasis on shared plates, The Terrace is located on the upper level of the historic Marcy Casino, and boasts one of the most pleasant views in the city.
- 31 TIPICO COFFEE**
1084 Elmwood Avenue
Fresh-roasted coffee and specialty foods are served in a bright, open space just down the street from the AKG. A great place to stop during a day exploring the neighborhood.
- 32 ZIO'S DELI & HEROES**
1055 Elmwood Avenue
A bit of NYC in the heart of the Elmwood Village, Zio's Deli serves inventive original sandwiches and fresh takes on old favorites.
- 33 INNBUFFALO**
619 Lafayette Avenue
The 1898 Hewitt Mansion on Lafayette Avenue is now a unique hotel, featuring Victorian charm, contemporary conveniences, and a great location for exploring the city.
- 34 THE RICHARDSON HOTEL**
444 Forest Avenue (on the Richardson Olmsted Campus)
A national historic landmark, the magnificent Richardson Hotel sits on the 40 acres of the Richardson Olmsted Campus, a short walk from the AKG. In addition to elegant lodging, it features fine dining and living history in an unforgettable setting.

PLACES TO HAVE FUN

- 35 ELMWOOD VILLAGE SUMMER CONCERT SERIES@BIDWELL PARK**
78 Bidwell Parkway
Featuring everything from skiffle to dub to the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, this Tuesday night free concert series is a great way to spend a beautiful Buffalo Summer evening.
- 36 ELMWOOD/BIDWELL FARMERS MARKET**
Elmwood Avenue and Bidwell Parkway
Local farmers and craftspeople gather every Saturday morning to sell the things they've grown and made to an ever-growing crowd of happy Buffalonians.
- 37 HOYT LAKE BOAT RENTALS**
199 Lincoln Parkway, Hoyt Lake, Delaware Park
Traditional handmade rowboats and distinctive "Floatingo" boats make Hoyt Lake a delightful spot for a summer paddle.
- 38 SHAKESPEARE IN DELAWARE PARK**
199 Lincoln Parkway
This annual outdoor theatrical experience is free for everyone, bringing the works of The Bard to life in a beautiful park, steps from the AKG.

MORE NEIGHBORHOODS, MORE ART

- HALLWALLS CONTEMPORARY ARTS CENTER**
341 Delaware Avenue
Since 1974, Hallwalls has championed the work of contemporary artists of diverse backgrounds, including people working in film, video, literature, music, performance, media and the visual arts.
- CEPA GALLERY**
617 Main Street
Located in Buffalo's historic Market Arcade Complex, CEPA Gallery is a contemporary photography and visual arts center with impact in both local and national communities.
- BIG ORBIT GALLERY**
617 Main Street
Through eclectic programming that ranges from painting to live sound sculpture, Big Orbit extends the legacy of artistic innovation historically associated with Buffalo, providing a basis for the creation of new boundary-pushing work.

- UB ANDERSON GALLERY**
1 Martha Jackson Place
The renowned collections of David Anderson and Martha Jackson are at the foundation of this growing gallery, donated to University at Buffalo in 2000.
- UB CFA GALLERY**
103 Center for the Arts
A thriving hub for the arts, this gallery on UB's North Campus is a place where art is both made and experienced.
- CASTELLANI ART MUSEUM**
7 Varsity Drive, Niagara University, NY
At the center of the Niagara University campus, the CAM's permanent collection includes over 5,000 pieces of modern and contemporary art.
- K ART**
808 Main Street
K Art Gallery is one of the only Native American-owned commercial art galleries with a primary and robust focus on the works of established and emerging Native American, First Nations and Indigenous contemporary artists.
- RIVALRY PROJECTS**
106 College Street
A commercial art gallery and arts production space located in Buffalo's historic Allentown neighborhood, Rivalry exhibits emerging, mid-career and underrepresented artists working in all media.
- RAFT OF SANITY**
106 College Street
The Raft creates connections between artists, collectors, critics, and the community in a welcoming environment which supports artistic excellence, creativity, and innovation.
- EL MUSEO FRANCISCO OLLER Y DIEGO RIVERA**
91 Allen Street
El Museo provides programming intended to strengthen our communities with the presentation and support of diverse artists and cultures.
